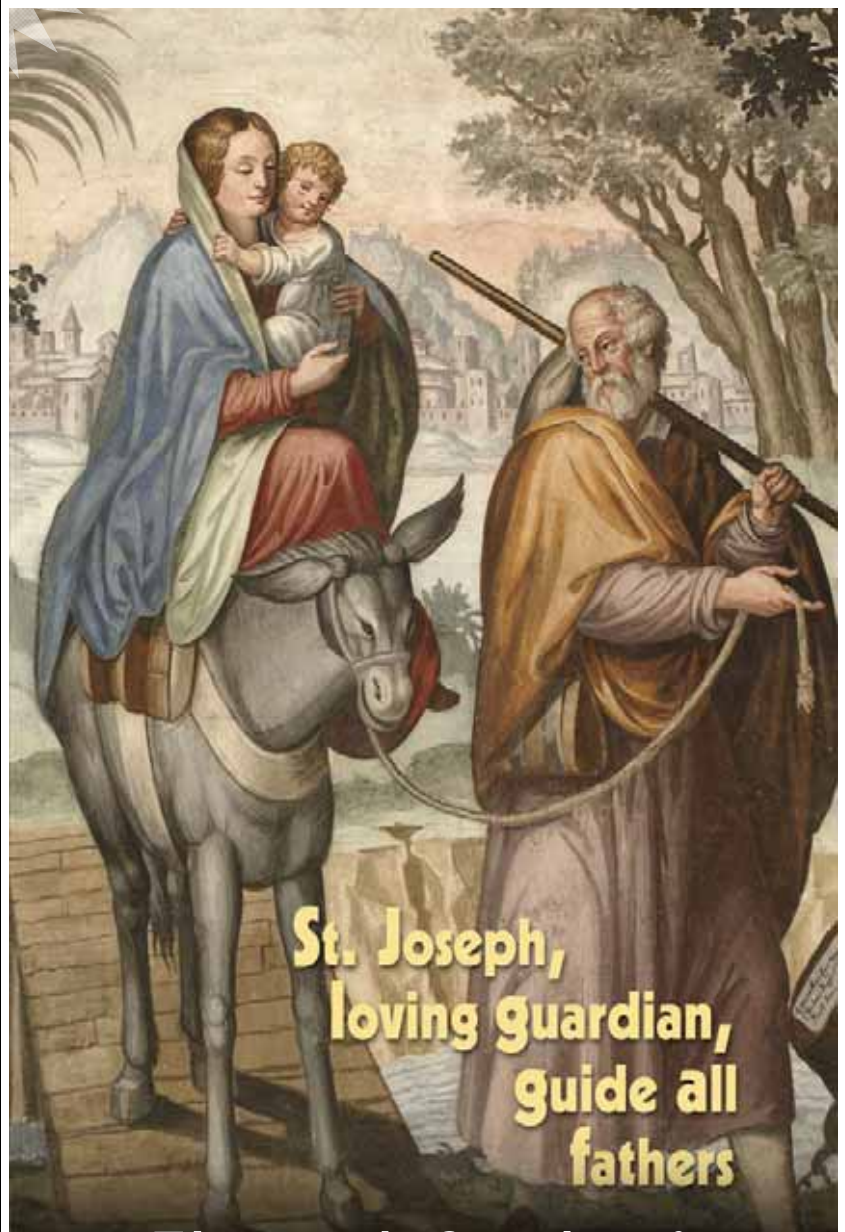

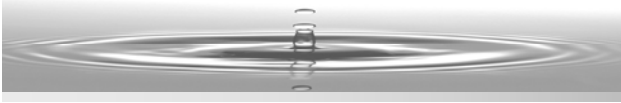

Reflections from Fr. David

Over the last several years legitimate concerns have been raised regarding religious freedom for Catholics and other Christians in our nation. There is a disturbing and growing trend in which we have seen public and state pressure put on Christians regarding the practice of our faith in ways that would have been inconceivable less than a generation ago. Governmental, social, political and business entities are willing to require Christians to turn their back on the traditional tenets and practice of their faith if they want access to the public arena, the marketplace or even to do works of charity and service.

Now comes a report from the Vatican concerning the worldwide persecution of Christians around the world. I want to share this information with you...it is something about which we should all be aware. Below is a story from the online version of a British Catholic newspaper, *The Catholic Herald* (the article can be found at <http://www.catholicherald.co.uk/news/2013/06/03/vatican-official-says-100000-christians-are-killed-each-year-because-of-their-faith/>).

Here is the article:

More than 100,000 Christians are killed each year because of their faith, and millions more face bigotry, intolerance and marginalization because of their beliefs, a Vatican official has said.

Archbishop Silvano Tomasi, the Vatican's permanent observer to US agencies in Geneva, told the Human Rights Council that "credible research" by Massimo Introvigne, a former representative of the Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe, on combating intolerance and discrimination against Christians, "has reached the shocking conclusion that an estimate of more than 100,000 Christians are violently killed because of some relation to their faith every year."

In addition, he said, "in some Western countries, where historically the Christian presence has been an integral part of society, a trend emerges that tends to marginalize Christianity in public life, ignore historic and social contributions and even restrict the ability of faith communities to carry out social charitable services."

But in fact, Archbishop Tomasi said, "The Christian religion, as other faith communities," serves the true good of humanity by educating members in their human dignity, their rights and responsibilities toward others and in serving their communities and the poor with schools, hospitals, homes for the aged, work in refugee camps and other acts of charity.

During a meeting in Tirana, Albania, last month, the secretary of the Pontifical Council for Justice and Peace said: "Examples of intolerance and discrimination against Christians have not diminished, but rather increased" in member-states of the Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe, which includes 57 countries in Europe, Central Asia and North America.

Bishop Mario Toso, addressing the OSCE's high-level conference on tolerance and non-discrimination, said that across the 57 nations "a sharp dividing line has been drawn between religious belief and religious practice", in a way that tells Christians they can believe whatever they want and worship however they would like inside the walls of their churches, "but they simply cannot act on those beliefs in public."

The bishop said there has been a "deliberate twisting and limiting of what religious freedom actually means," an interpretation which claims to promote tolerance for all people, but in fact tells Christians that they cannot wear symbols of their faith, publicly uphold traditional teachings on sexual morality and marriage and conscientiously object at work to procedures that violate the tenets of their faith.

"Intolerance in the name of 'tolerance' must be named for what it is and publically condemned," Bishop Toso said. "To deny religiously informed moral argument a place in the public square is intolerant and anti-democratic."

Bishops have declared that June 21-July 4 2013 will be the Second Annual Fortnight for Freedom - a two week period during which people and parishes around the nation are invited to pray, to gather and to witness in support of the importance of religious freedom for Catholics and other people of faith in our nation. Stay tuned for details about how we will observe this here at St. Mary Immaculate Parish.

A Real Man *by Ernie Basile*

On this Father's Day I would like to write about a man who was an exceptional husband and father. He was not like the men whom society looks up to, strives to be, or admires. He was quiet, and didn't do anything noteworthy. With little education but strong character he was a tradesman who worked hard all his life, a life which centered on his wife, his son, and his God.

He never made very much money, didn't advance in his job, and didn't live a long life. In the world's view, he was a nobody. But he was a man of hidden virtue. His love was deep, his trust unwavering, and his inner strength enduring when extraordinary challenges and trials came into his life unexpectedly.

If you're thinking, "This man is a saint", you're right. He is Joseph, husband of Mary and foster father of Jesus. A real father, a real man. The gospels do not record a single word that he ever spoke. But how eloquently he spoke by what he did! Engaged to Mary, he learns that she is pregnant. How shocked, hurt, and confused he must have felt. But he seems to think only of Mary, and her welfare.

Late in Mary's pregnancy he is required to travel to Bethlehem. He's unable to find decent lodgings for Mary, who must give birth in a stable. What a threat to a man's pride, the need to be a true provider, to protect. Again, he's not swallowed up in his own ego needs, but is present to and for his wife and son.

When Herod's violence threatens the safety of Jesus, Joseph packs up and leaves with his family to a foreign land - true immigrants - surrounded by a strange language, customs, a whole new world. How did he find work and provide for them? How did they survive this upheaval in their lives?

There's an old saying, "The apple doesn't fall far from the tree". I like to think that if we want to know more about Joseph, look at Jesus. For it was at his father's side that Jesus learned what it is to be a real man. Decency, loyalty, compassion, bravery. No bravado nor need to be noticed, praised, or be in control. And certainly a profound respect and attitude towards women as equals, so contrary to the prevailing culture of the time.

As we honor all fathers today, we think of Joseph, the man chosen by God to share his life with Mary, and to raise His only begotten Son.

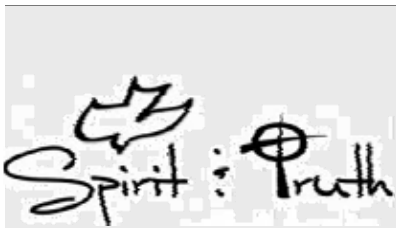

When you access the online giving website the first time, you will need to **create** a personal account. There is a "Watch Help Video" link which shows a brief tutorial on creating a new account, as well as a FAQs link and other useful information.

After you create your User ID and Password, and enter your basic contact info, you will receive a confirmation email with another link you'll need to click to **confirm** your account. Once confirmed, you can enter your payment methods and make new gifts, either one-time or recurring, to our weekly, monthly, and special collections throughout the year. You can also manage your active giving and view your giving history. Again there are Help Videos available for each of these options.

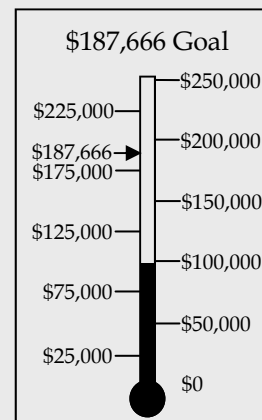
2013 Catholic Ministries Annual Appeal Progress Report
