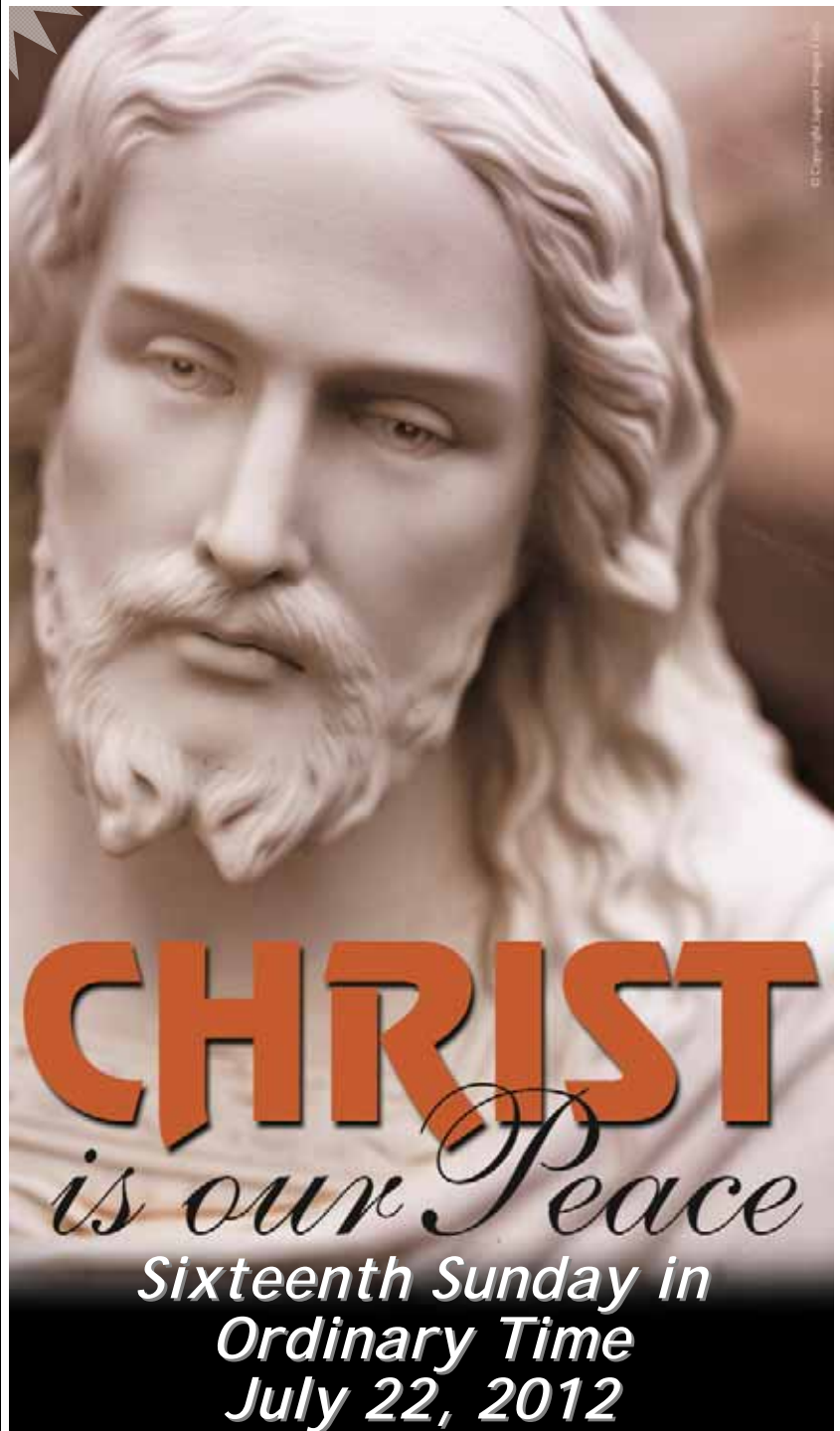

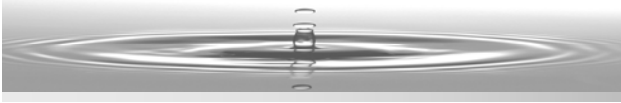

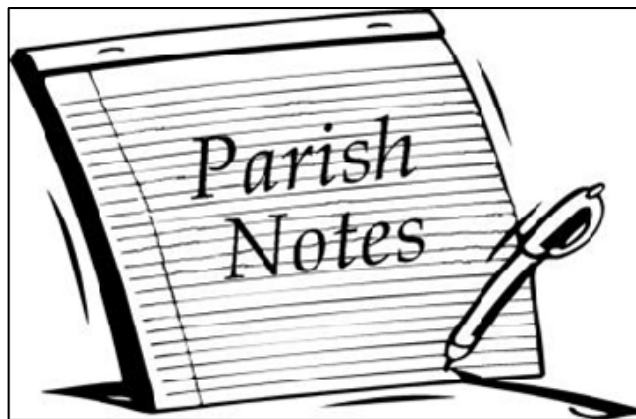

Confirmation Mentors work with adolescents (generally 7th and 8th graders) as they go through a transitional time in their lives and begin to develop questions about their faith. Teamed with a partner, Mentors meet with their assigned group of 5-12 students for 2 years & 3 months, conducting class sessions and arranging 4 service projects per year for their group. Mentors receive the help they need, to effectively pass on their faith. They:

- Participate in an on-line course, enabling them to better understand the teachings of the church.
- Attend 4 training sessions per year to discuss questions and learn new ways to engage adolescents.
- Are given complete lesson plans, reference materials, and guidance every step of the way.

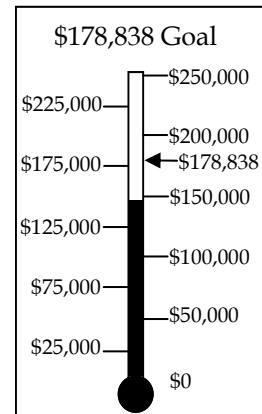
2012 Catholic Ministries Annual Appeal Progress Report

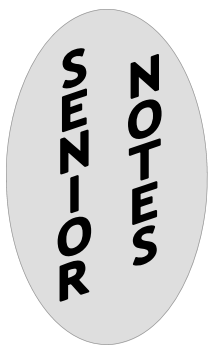

Bibles for Youth, Teens, Families Bible Basics, Column 3, by Carol Kloss

When my Aunt Rita heard I was teaching the Bible, she told me she'd tried to read the Bible once—but only once, because it was too hard to understand. She had a point! If you want to get a Bible for older children or teens, get an edition that helps younger readers understand and connect with the Bible's text.

A great choice for children fifth-grade age and older is Breakthrough! The Bible for Young Catholics (Saint Mary's Press). This Bible uses the Good News Translation, a simpler English translation that's good for children ages 10-13 as well as adults. The Breakthrough! Bible helps readers focus on the Bible's key people with features such as "Bible People Interviews." Other short sections ("Study It," "Live It," "Pray It," and almost 100 "Catholic Connections") guide children in relating the Bible to their lives.

For teens, try The Catholic Youth Bible (Saint Mary's Press). Short introductions to each biblical book offer both "in-depth" and "quick facts" information. Features such as "Did You Know?" provide useful background on ancient culture and traditions. "Study It," "Live It," "Pray It," and "Catholic Connections" offer life connections just for teens. Especially nice are the Suggested Reading Plans, including "A Walk through the Bible."

If you want to make the Bible part of your family life, a great choice is The Catholic Faith and Family Bible, published by Harper Collins. Articles such as "Reading the Bible as a Catholic Family" and "Frequently Asked Questions and Answers about the Bible," give parents guidance they may need to feel secure with the Bible. Excellent sidebars present family-oriented ideas for prayer, reflection, and action. Short articles make connections to many aspects of Catholic faith and practice useful for the whole family.

With these helpful editions, the Bible won't be "too hard to understand" for anyone!

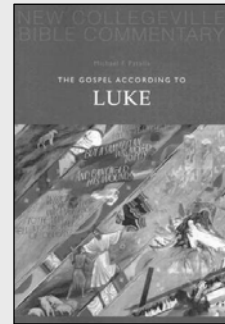

Complaint Procedures

For compliance with the Charter for Protection of Children and Young People, it is required that procedures are to be readily available in printed form for persons making a complaint about sexual abuse in the principal languages in which the liturgy is celebrated. (Article 2, Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People) Procedures are to be the subject of public announcements at least annually.

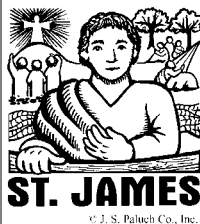
