

Communications from the Bishop

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

For a year now we have been praying the Mass with the English translation of the Third Edition of the Roman Missal. I am grateful to our priests, deacons, liturgists (especially Sister Sharon Marie Stola, OSB of the Divine Worship Office), musicians and catechists who have provided leadership with the transition. I am grateful to everyone for the positive spirit and patience that has characterized the transition.

As I go from parish to parish, I have a sense that the transition is going well. The spoken responses of the people and the common, sung parts of the Mass are particularly strong. Some of the priest's prayers are long and complex, and thus require careful proclamation and reception. On the other hand, these prayers express our faith deeply and help us to enter more fully into the relationship between God and humanity made possible by the Incarnation, Death and Resurrection of Christ.

More time is needed to become comfortable with the new translation and to appreciate its value. The first year was a time to deal with the basics. As we continue on, I encourage our priests to expand their use of the many options for Eucharistic Prayers, Masses for Various Needs and Occasions, Votive Masses and Invocations for the Penitential Act. I also encourage those with decent singing voices to consider singing more parts of the Mass, especially on Sundays and other special occasions.

The Eucharist is one the greatest gifts made possible by the first coming of our Lord, because it is the fullest presence of that coming among us still and because it draws us as close as possible to the joys that await his second coming. As we begin the second year of the missal's use, I invite you to expand your appreciation of its potential for making the Mass our greatest prayer.

Reflections from Fr. David



This weekend in the Gospel we hear the familiar and challenging warning from John the Baptist...the one sent by God to "...prepare the way of the Lord..."

It appears that John's message from God was to tell the people that preparing for the Coming One best begins with radical, serious repentance and (in the old phrase) amendment of life:

"Produce good fruits as evidence of your repentance; and do not begin to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our father,' for I tell you, God can raise up children to Abraham from these stones. Even now the ax lies at the root of the trees. Therefore every tree that does not produce good fruit will be cut down and thrown into the fire."

Luke 3:8-9

Told by the Baptist that they have to begin to do and the things differently if they really want to be open to the coming of the Lord, they ask a very honest question and John gives them a very accurate answer:

Order, order!

The crowds asked John the Baptist, "What should we do?" He said to them in reply, "Whoever has two cloaks should share with the person who has none. And whoever has food should do likewise." Even tax collectors came to be baptized and they said to him, "Teacher, what should we do?" He answered them, "Stop collecting more than what is prescribed." Soldiers also asked him, "And what is it that we should do?" He told them, "Do not practice extortion, do not falsely accuse anyone, and be satisfied with your wages."

Now the people were filled with expectation, and all were asking in their hearts whether John might be the Christ. John answered them all, saying, "I am baptizing you with water, but one mightier than I is coming. I am not worthy to loosen the thongs of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fan is in his hand to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his barn, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable

fire." Exhorting them in many other ways, he preached good news to the people.

Luke 3:10-18

One of the clear messages that seems to come through these holy admonitions is that there is a particular order that needs to be in place in order to for there to be a "plain" and "straight" path for the Lord to enter our hearts, our lives, our relationships and our world. When we are, when things are, when relationships are, when the world is disordered, one of the consequences of the disordering is that it creates barriers between us and God...between us and each other.

How we live, the way we do things, how we live our relationships, how we approach people and things...how seriously we live our faith...*all of this matters!* And it is for that reason that the Church and the content of our faith relentlessly addresses these issues.

When our insistent and stubborn preference or practice is to order our life according to *our* will, to satisfy *our own* desires we usually lead ourselves and each other in dis-ordered ways. Ways of doing things that are not in accord with the order for human life that God has established can only, in the end, wind up being dis-ordered. God's way is the only true standard by which we can measure the goodness, faithfulness and justice of our lives and of this world.

Seeking the help of God to try to begin for the renewal and reordering of our lives is our only option and our only hope. Why do we keep fooling ourselves into thinking that our way will be alright?! So, as our Advent preparations continue, as we carry on with positioning ourselves to welcome Christ at Christmas—and at all times—let us seek not merely to order and decorate our homes and trees according to our own tastes. Rather, let us decorate and order our lives with the will of God who orders our lives. What a gift that would be in our lives! What a way to make a gift of ourselves to the Lord who loves us!


