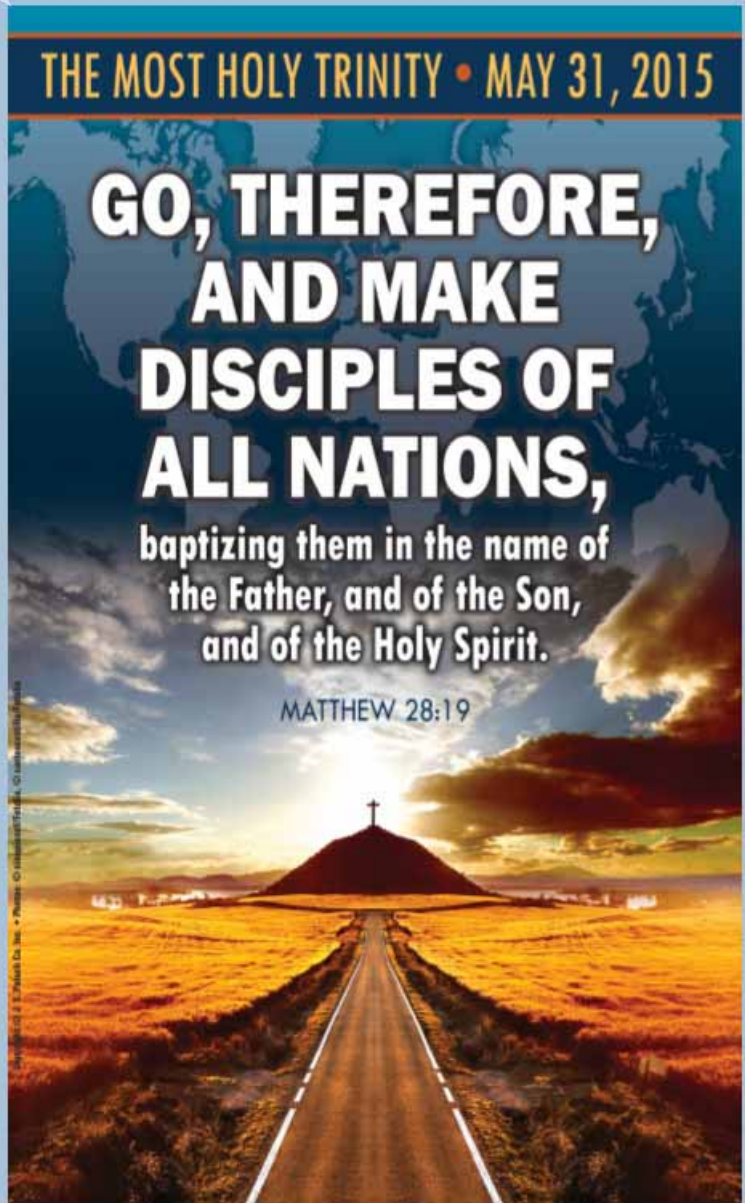

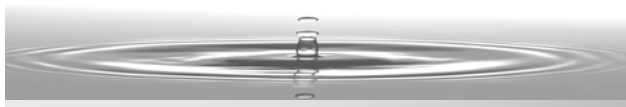

Last week the Republic of Ireland voted to legalize same-sex marriage in that nation. Over 61% of those voting (and the turnout was heavy) voted in favor of the measure.

Ireland is the first nation to legalize same-sex marriage by ballot; in all other places this change has taken place either by legislation or judicial edict.

In the minds of many people around the world, Ireland is considered to be a very Catholic country. Much of the modern strength of the Roman Catholic community in our nation was built on the faith of Irish Immigrants (the waves of other European Catholic immigrants as well as those from Central and South America came later). So how can it be that a country and people with such a strong Catholic identity has, in such large numbers, embraced an understanding of marriage that is so opposed to the teaching of our faith and tradition?

First of all, the Catholic Church in Ireland has been rocked by sexual abuse scandals over the last many years. The profound offense and disappointment that Catholics in Ireland felt in learning of both the evil perpetrated by some of their priests as well as the ineptitude of their bishops to handle this crisis with wisdom and pastoral love for their people has alienated many people from the Church. It will take many years to win them back and re-earn their trust, if ever that can be done.

And the sexual abuse scandal, however one wants to frame it, has seriously undermined the moral authority of the Church and its leadership; it has also encouraged people to doubt the Church's moral teaching.

In addition to this serious wound to the Body of Christ in Ireland, there is another equally serious weakness: that is the failure of the Catholic Church in Ireland—and just about everywhere else—to make the case for the truth and importance of our teachings, both in terms of doctrine and morals. Among many other things, the

Church has, for many years, just about given up the effort to “make the case” for marriage, to promote a clear understanding of the holy mission of marriage and family life, the holy role of husbands and wives, the vital role that intact, healthy families play in society and in the Church. The Church has failed to develop an interesting and effective way to speak about human sexuality to counter the compelling and dreadful message of our culture.



What does the Irish vote on gay marriage

The Church's abdication of these vital tasks creates a vacuum...and whenever failures of the Church create a vacuum, bad things happen to human communities and human persons.

The Church around the world has suddenly taken notice of this predicament and is trying to take action. But the power of the cultural message (and its implicit rejection of our faith and tradition) has a firm grip on the hearts and minds of many.

Let me be clear: the issue at stake is not whether or not we love or accept gay people. That issue is settled by Christ himself: we are to love everyone!

What is at stake is a total redefinition of marriage. And this seismic cultural shift has taken place without serious, intelligent, rational, studied conversation. The appeal is always to the personal and the emotional. And that never allows for clear thought, reflection or decision-making.

Please pray for the Church, our leaders and all our people: may we with faith, wisdom, love and compassion do the hard work necessary to turn the tide on the abandonment of the truth of marriage. There is no need for hopelessness. After Roe v. Wade, how many people thought we could effectively change so many hearts and minds on the issue of abortion?! This is not a fight against gay people; rather it is an ongoing effort in our love of all people to lead everyone to the One who is the Truth and away from the confusion of our times.

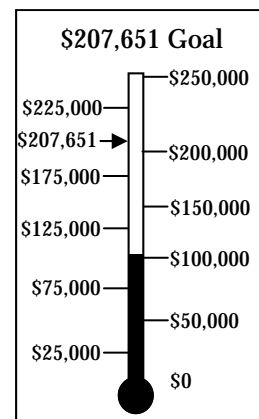
2015 Catholic Ministries Annual Appeal Progress Report

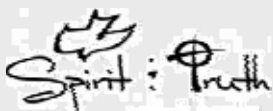

The Corpus Christi Eucharistic Procession Sunday, June 7 following the 12:15 p.m. Mass

Processing through the community with the Blessed Sacrament on the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ is a venerable Church tradition. The procession is an outward demonstration of Catholic faith and belief in the real presence of the risen Christ, under the appearance of the Consecrated Host.

It is believed Corpus Christi processions date back to the 14th century. They are still held on the Feast of Corpus Christi throughout the world, often with the regal splendor and rich traditions of years past. The procession is made up of clergy, Catholic groups and organizations, and lay people and their families. The Holy Eucharist is held in a processional monstrance carried by a priest or bishop. The monstrance itself is protected by a decorated canopy.

In Saint John Paul II's Apostolic Letter, "Mane Nobiscum Domine", he urged all Catholics to participate in Corpus Christi processions as a public profession of their faith in the real presence of Christ in the Holy Sacrament. He wrote, "Let us also celebrate with particular devotion the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, with its traditional procession. Our faith in the God who took flesh in order to become our companion along the way needs to be everywhere proclaimed, especially in our streets and homes, as an expression of our grateful love and as an inexhaustible source of blessings."

This year on the Feast of Corpus Christi, we will also mark the 13-Year Anniversary of Eucharistic Adoration at St. Mary Immaculate Parish. May our adoration never cease! 

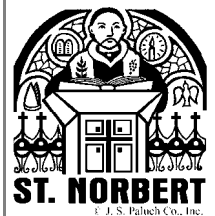
