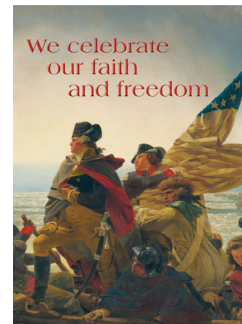

Bishop John Carroll was the cousin of one of the signers of the Declaration of Independence, and he himself became the first bishop of the United States. In 1791, he penned this prayer to be recited at all the parishes in his diocese (which was the whole country at that time!). His prayer remembers the dependence that we have on Almighty God to bring prosperity, peace, and true liberty to our nation. As we prepare to celebrate our country's independence this week, I think Bishop Carroll's words of prayer can rejuvenate our country and help us to remember that all that we have and enjoy as a nation and as a community come from God. May our own words of prayer in these days call on God's assistance that we might have peace and security, freedom of religion, and reasonable prosperity and happiness in this life, with the promise of eternal life in the Kingdom of God.

Bishop John Carroll's Prayer for Government

We pray, Thee O Almighty and Eternal God! Who through Jesus Christ hast revealed Thy glory to all nations, to preserve the works of Thy mercy, that Thy Church, being spread through the whole world, may continue with unchanging faith in the confession of Thy Name.

We pray Thee, who alone art good and holy, to endow with heavenly knowledge, sincere zeal, and sanctity of life, our chief bishop, Pope Francis, the Vicar of Our Lord Jesus Christ, in the government of his Church; our own bishop, Daniel, all other bishops, prelates, and pastors of the Church; and especially those who are appointed to exercise amongst us the functions of the holy ministry, and conduct Thy people into the ways of salvation.

We pray Thee O God of might, wisdom, and justice! Through whom authority is rightly administered, laws are enacted, and judgment decreed, assist with Thy Holy Spirit of counsel and fortitude the President of these United States, that his administration may be conducted in righteousness, and be eminently useful to Thy people over whom he presides; by encouraging due respect for virtue and religion; by a faithful execution of the laws in justice and mercy; and by restraining vice and immorality. Let the light of Thy divine wisdom direct the deliberations of Congress, and shine forth in all the proceedings and laws framed for our rule and government, so that they may tend to the preservation of peace, the promotion of national happiness, the increase of industry, sobriety, and useful knowledge; and may perpetuate to us the blessing of equal liberty.

We pray for his excellency, the governor of this state, for the members of the assembly, for all judges, magistrates, and other officers who are appointed to guard our political welfare, that they may be enabled, by Thy powerful protection, to discharge the duties of their respective stations with honesty and ability.

We recommend likewise, to Thy unbounded mercy, all our brethren and fellow citizens throughout the United States, that they may be blessed in the knowledge and sanctified in the observance of Thy most holy law; that they may be preserved in union, and in that peace which the world cannot give; and after enjoying the blessings of this life, be admitted to those which are eternal.

Finally, we pray to Thee, O Lord of mercy, to remember the souls of Thy servants departed who are gone before us with the sign of faith and repose in the sleep of peace; the souls of our parents, relatives, and friends; of those who, when living, were members of this congregation, and particularly of such as are lately deceased; of all benefactors who, by their donations or legacies to this Church, witnessed their zeal for the decency of divine worship and proved their claim to our grateful and charitable remembrance. To these, O Lord, and to all that rest in Christ, grant, we beseech Thee, a place of refreshment, light, and everlasting peace, through the same Jesus Christ, Our Lord and Savior. Amen.

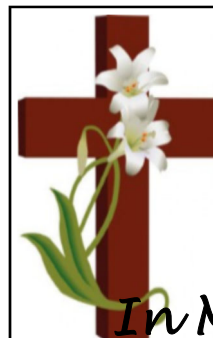

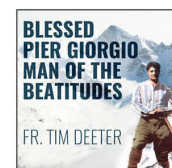
Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati

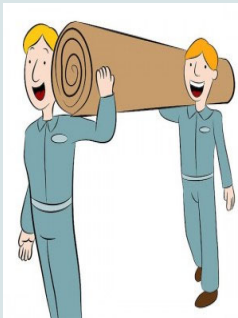

December 2018 Advent Giving Tree Donations funded a Mobile Food Pantry containing meats, fresh fruits and vegetables, as well as non-perishable items such as canned food and cereals. PRAYER TEAM FOR FR. DAVID MOWRY

During the month of July, our former associate pastor Fr. David Mowry will be on a 30-day silent retreat - and he needs your help! He is asking for people to pray for him every day July 1st through August 1st. Also known as the Spiritual Exercises, this 30-day retreat consists of meditations, prayers, and contemplative practices developed by St. Ignatius of Loyola to help people deepen their relationship with God. Fr. David asks for your prayers to help him during this month of silence and solitude.

Eucharistic Adoration at SMIP

This year's Feast of Corpus Christi also marked the 17th anniversary of our Eucharistic Adoration Ministry, where more than 100,000 hours of prayer have been offered since 2002. Pope Francis stated that Eucharistic Adoration is "the secret to knowing the love of Jesus Christ."

The SMIP Adoration Chapel is open with exposition continuously from 7 p.m. Sundays through 9 p.m. Fridays, which is possible due to the volunteers who come for regular weekly Holy Hours. There are currently a number of open hours at various times of the day and night needing a regular adorer—substitute volunteers are always appreciated, too, since the ministry finds a substitute for you whenever you can't make it. Do you have one hour per week to spend with Jesus?
