The Word from Fr. Pat / La Palabra del Padre Pat / Słowo od Ojca Pat

Seek the Lord while he may be found, call him while he is near. Isaiah 55:6

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Seeking the Lord is the whole project of our spiritual lives. Not that the Lord is hiding from us, of course. It's just that our human minds can be so easily distracted, so quickly wrapped up in the business of everyday life. Before we know it, the day is almost over, and we've not prayed, haven't taken time to realize that God is among us, haven't felt his presence. There's a trite Christian adage that says something like, "If you feel far from God, who moved?" So when we set out to seek the Lord, it's more that we have to take the moment every now and then during the day, to recognize his presence in our lives, ask where he's leading us, and turn toward him once again.

This is the seedbed of discernment. Discernment is that spiritual practice that, when we are confronted with choices to be made, seeks God's direction. These would be choices like business practices, where to attend school, entering into relationships, how to care for an ailing loved one, how to deal with a family crisis, and so many more life-changing moments. Discernment has been a frequent topic of my bulletin articles in the past, because it is so important, and also because I do it a lot! There are a lot of important issues for the Pastor to discern!

We often think of discernment when it comes to a vocational choice, namely the priesthood, or even the permanent diaconate. Those are occasions for discernment to be sure, but that doesn't let everyone else off the hook. One should seriously discern any life choice: marriage, a new job, moving to a new location, and on and on. Another aspect of discernment absolutely has to be the way we live our faith. What is Jesus calling us to do in these days? How is it that we share our gifts with others, take a stand for things that are important, or build up the kingdom in any way? This isn't just the priest's responsibility; this is everyone's task. Discerning the will of God and what he wants us to do should be something we spend time on each and every day. Seek the Lord!

Here at Saint Mary's, we want to be seeking the Lord's will so that we can bring the happiness of the Christian life to others. With that in mind, we have been working on a program called "The 99." The name describes how many Catholics think of themselves. We see ourselves as part of the flock, part of the 99, safe in the care of the Good Shepherd. We do not see ourselves as needing to be found, like the "one" sheep who went astray. Nor do we see the need to seek after the "one", sheep who might be lost.

This experience is a call to recognize that we just might be the one sheep who is lost, even though we go to church every Sunday. This is a call to enter into a deeper relationship with Jesus. It is also a call to recognize when we need to be the shepherd to others, leaving the flock to spread the Gospel.

Many of our parish leaders, including our staff, Parish Pastoral Council, and members of our Finance Council, have been part of our parish preview of this experience. Now we are inviting everyone to experience it. This three evening multi-media experience will be a time to slow down and open ourselves to an encounter with the Holy Spirit and deepen our relationship to Jesus.







Adult Faith Formation, then, is the lifelong process of finding and falling in love with God in the midst of our human lives. Every one of us, by virtue of our Baptism, is on a lifelong journey of faith. Consequently, Adult Faith Formation has as its purpose to support, nourish, and challenge adults as they explore their faith, experience its power, grow in relationship with God. Thus, we strive here at St. Mary Immaculate Parish, to offer, plan, and implement a wide variety of faith forming programs and opportunities for all adults.

What are the goals of Adult Faith Formation?

The U.S. Bishops outline three key goals of Adult Faith Formation (OHWB #67-73):

- 1. Inviting and enabling ongoing conversion to Jesus in holiness of life:
 - helping adults acquire an attitude of conversion to the Lord
 - leading adults to repentance of sin, reconciliation through the sacraments and deepening faith in Jesus
- 2. Promoting and supporting active membership in the Christian community:
 - helping adults make a conscious and firm decision to live the faith through membership in the Christian community
 - inviting and supporting baptized adults in their co-responsibility for the Church's mission and life
- 3. Calling and preparing adults to act as disciples in mission to the world
 - · inviting baptized adults to evangelization and justice in the world

BIBLICAL EXPERIENCES

SMI will offer a new kind of Bible Study this year. Our studies will become Bible Experiences in which people actually become participants in the stories of salvation history.

We will enter these bible stories not as a silent observer but as a participant. We see, hear, and smell the scene. We use all our senses. We interact with the characters, talk to them, and listen to them as well so to see them as real people.

Our first set of experiences will be **Women of Torah**. These are the brave women who believed in God and worked to make him known. It is based on Women of Torah by Stephen Binz. The book is optional but a great resource for your personal library. The Bible Experiences will focus on the women who prepare us for Advent.

LECTIO DIVINA: PRAYING THE SCRIPTURES



Lectio Divina (literally divine reading) is a way of becoming immersed in the Scriptures very personally. Lectio Divina was first introduced by St. Gregory of Nyssa (c 330- 395), and also encouraged by St. Benedict of Nursia (c 480-547), the founder of the Benedictine order. It's a way of developing a closer relationship with God by reflecting prayerfully on His words. In Lectio Divina, the chosen spiritual text is read four times in total, giving an opportunity to think deeply about it and respond thoughtfully. When we practice Lectio Divina, we can imagine we're actually involved in the events of Scripture.

Join us each week as we delve into the origins of this spiritual practice and practice it .



10/1 - Session 1: Introduction and overview. We will examine prayer as a relationship between us and the trinity. We will also examine the history of the Lectio Divina practice. Then we will examine the distinction between Centering Prayer and Lectio.

10/8 - Session 2: This session will focus on the first two movements of the Lectio-Divina prayer. We will practice these movements and their will be time for sharing insights.

10/15 - Session 3: In this session we will review the first two movements of Lectio-Divina but our main focus will be on the third and fourth movements of the prayer. As before in session 2, we will practice these movements and there will be time for sharing insights.

10/22 - Session 4: Putting it all together. We will review all four movements of Lectio and do some practicing and again sharing of insights. Lastly, we will explore what are the next steps.

WINTER STUDY - Explore the most popular sermon ever delivered!



What might these teachings have meant to his disciples and to the others who first heard them? How do they enhance our reading of the rest of the Gospel of Matthew, and how do they speak across the centuries to listeners today? How, if we pay careful attention to his words, does Jesus provide us a road map to living as God would have us live?

PRAYING THE "OUR FATHER" WITH JESUS

Michael Simone, S.J. (Professor of Theology @ Boston College) helps us view the Lord's Prayer through Jesus's eyes. This is a personal project that Fr. Simone pursues in addition to his academic research and writing. Simone reminds us that the library of books we call the Hebrew Bible or the "Old Testament" was the only Bible Jesus knew. As Simone explores selected phrases or segments from the "Our Father," he points us to passages and words that may have captivated the mind of Jesus when Jesus uttered that prayer. Simone's reflections demonstrate to the modern Christian believer just how powerful a source of revelation the Hebrew Bible continues to be.







LENTEN STUDY - A Beginner's Guide to Holy Week

Jesus' final days were full of risk. Every move he made was filled with anticipation, danger, and the potential for great loss or great reward. Jesus risked his reputation when he entered Jerusalem in victory parade. He risked his life when he dared to teach in the temple. His followers risked everything when they left behind their homes, or anointed him with costly perfume. We take risks as we read and re-read theses stories, finding new meanings and new challenges.


