- 4. Honor your father and your mother.
- 5. You shall not kill.
- 6. You shall not commit adultery.
- 7. You shall not steal.
- 8. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.
- 9. You shall not covet your neighbor's wife.
- 10. You shall not covet your neighbor's goods.

# TWO GREAT COMMANDMENTS (as given to us by Jesus and found in Matthew 22:36-40)

- 1. You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind.
- 2. You shall love your neighbor as yourself.

#### PRECEPTS OF THE CHURCH

- 1. Participate in Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation, and avoid unnecessary work on these days.
- 2. Fast and abstain on the days appointed.
- 3. Confess your sins at least once a year.
- 4. Receive Holy Eucharist at least once a year at Easter time.

## GIFTS OF THE HOLY SPIRIT (Isaiah 11:1-2)

# 1. The Gift of WISDOM - to feel your presence beside me

The Holy Spirit helps a person make the best choices in order to live a holy life. This gift leads us to pray before making decisions and to seek guidance from people who are experienced. A wise person has learned how to look at life from all perspectives, to see and understand the "whole picture" of a situation.

## 2. The Gift of UNDERSTANDING - to follow God's way

The Holy Spirit helps a person uncover the deeper meaning of the mystery of God's creation and our faith. This gift leads us to be tolerant and sympathetic of others. It helps us sense when someone is hurting or in need of compassion. Understanding is the ability to see from another person's "heart" to feel the feelings of others and to put these before your own. Problems are only opportunities with thorns on them.

# 3. The Gift of COUNSEL - to enlighten and guide me

The Holy Spirit helps a person make choices to live as a faithful follower of Jesus. This gift leads us to pray and ask for advice before making decisions. Counsel is knowing when to try harder - sometimes God's answer is "Wait." Also known as Right Judgment.

## 4. The Gift of FORTITUDE - to stand up and be strong

The Holy Spirit helps a person stand up for their faith; being open to suffer for the Lord. This gift helps us overcome any obstacles that would keep us from practicing our faith. Fortitude is not being afraid of doing what is right in spite of obstacles and difficulties. Also known as Courage.

# 5. The Gift of KNOWLEDGE - to know right from wrong

The Holy Spirit helps a person to see God at work in their lives. This gift helps us to know and choose the right path that will lead us to God. "Letting go and letting God". Knowledge is focusing on what really counts and keeping our priorities straight.

# 6. The Gift of PIETY - to worship and pray

The Holy Spirit helps a person to respect God and the dignity of others. This gift inspires us to joyfully want to serve God and others. Piety awakens in us the mystery of God - seeing Him in simple everyday things: the sunset, clouds, the mountains. Also known as Reverence.

7. The Gift of FEAR OF THE LORD - to always be awed by the mighty works of our God The Holy Spirit helps a person to be filled with the wonder and awe of God's mighty power and love. This gift leads us to love and respect God so much that we do not want to offend Him by words or actions. Respect for the Lord gives confidence and security - there's comfort in knowing there's someone bigger than we are. Also known as Wonder & Awe.

When the Gifts of the Holy Spirit are nurtured, they produce the <u>Fruit of the Holy Spirit</u>, which are charity, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, generosity, gentleness, faithfulness, modesty, self-control, chastity. (Galatians 5: 22-23)

(Note: you are not tested on the Fruit of the Spirit, they are just good to know!)
