### **C8 Acts of The Apostles 10:34-43**

#### **A Reading From The Acts Of The Apostles**

Peter proceeded to speak , saying:

“In truth, I see that god shows no partiality.

Rather, in every nation whoever fears him and acts uprightly is acceptable to him.

You know the word that he sent to the children of Israel as he proclaimed peace through Jesus Christ, who is Lord of all, what has happened all over Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John preached, how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy spirit and power.

He went about doing good and healing all those oppressed By the Devil, for God was with him.

We are witnesses of all that he did both in the country of the Jews, and in Jerusalem.

They put him to death by hanging him on a tree.

This man God raised on the third day, and granted that he be visible, not to all the people, but to us, the witnesses chosen by God in advance, who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead.

He commissioned us to preach to the people and testify that that he is the one appointed by God as judge of the living and the dead.

(The second reading)

## **A Reading from the Letter of Paul to the Romans**

Hope does not disappoint, because the love of God has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us. For while we were still helpless, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly. Indeed, only with difficulty does one die for a just person, though perhaps for a good person one might even find courage to die.

But God proves his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us. How much more then, since we are now justified by the blood of Jesus, will we be saved through him from the wrath.

Indeed, if, while we were enemies, we were reconciled to God through the death of His Son, how much more, once reconciled, will we be saved by his life. Not only that, but we also boast of God through our Lord Jesus Christ through whom we have now received reconciliation.

**Romans 5:5-11**

## **A Reading from the Letter of Paul to the Romans**

Are you unaware that we who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We are indeed buried with him through baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live in newness of life.

For if we have grown into union with him through a death like his, we shall also be united with him in the resurrection. We know that our old self was crucified with him, so that our sinful body might be done away with, that we might no longer be in slavery to sin. For a dead person has been absolved from sin.

If, then, we have died with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with him. We know that Christ, raised from the dead, dies no more; death no longer has power over him.

## **A Reading from the Letter of Paul to the Romans**

None of us lives for oneself, and no one dies for oneself.  
For if we live, we live for the Lord; and if we die, we die for  
the Lord: so then, whether we live or die, we are the Lord's.

For this is why Christ died and came to life, that he might  
be Lord of both the dead and the living. Why then do you  
judge your brother or sister? For we all stand before the  
judgment seat of God; for it is written:

“As I live, says the Lord, every knee shall bend be-  
fore me, and every tongue shall give praise to God.”

So then each of us shall give an account of himself to God.

**Romans 14:7-9, 10c-12**

## **A Reading from the Letter of Paul to the Romans**

If God is for us, who can be against us. God who did not  
spare his own Son but handed him over for us all, how will  
God not also give us everything else along with him? Who  
will bring a charge against God's Chosen ones? It is God  
who acquits us. Who will condemn? It is Christ Jesus who  
died, rather, was raised, who also is at the right hand of  
God, who indeed intercedes for us.

What will separate us from the love of Christ? Will anguish  
or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or  
peril, or the sword? No, in all these things we conquer  
overwhelmingly through him who loved us.

For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels,  
nor principalities, nor present things, nor future things, nor  
powers, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature will  
be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus  
our Lord.

**Romans 8:31b-35, 37-39**

## **A Reading from the Letter of Paul to the Corinthians**

If I speak in human and angelic tongues, but do not have love, I am a resounding gong or a clashing cymbal. And if I have the gift of prophecy and comprehend all mysteries and all knowledge; if I have all faith so as to move mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. If I give away everything I own, and if I hand my body over so that I may boast but do not have love, I gain nothing.

Love is patient, love is kind. It is not jealous, it is not pompous, it is not inflated, it is not rude, it does not seek its own interest, it is not quick-tempered, it does not brood over wrong-doing but rejoices with the truth. It bears all things, believes all things.

Love never fails. So faith, hope and love remain, these three; but the greatest of these is love.

## **A Reading from the Letter of Paul to the Corinthians**

For just as in Adam all die, so too in Christ shall all be brought to life, but each one in proper order; Christ the first fruits; then, at his coming, those who belong to Christ.

## **A Reading from the Letter of St Paul to the Corinthians**

Behold, I tell you a mystery. We shall not all fall asleep, but we will all be changed, in an instant, in the blink of an eye, at the last trumpet. For the trumpet will sound, the dead will be raised incorruptible, and we shall be changed. For that which is corruptible must clothe itself with incorruptibility, and that which is mortal must clothe itself with immortality. And when that which is corruptible clothes itself with incorruptibility and that which is mortal clothes itself with immortality, then the word that is written shall come about:

“Death is swallowed up in victory.  
Where, O Death, is your victory?  
Where, O Death, is your sting?”

The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.

## **A Reading from the Letter of St Paul to the Corinthians**

We know that the one who raised the Lord Jesus will raise us also with Jesus and place us with you in his presence. Everything indeed is for you, so that the grace bestowed in abundance on more and more people may cause the thanksgiving to overflow for the glory of God.

Therefore, we are not discouraged; rather, although our outer self is wasting away, our inner self is being renewed day by day. For this momentary light affliction is producing for us an eternal weight of glory beyond all comparison, as we look not to what is seen but to what is unseen; for what is seen is transitory, but what is unseen is eternal.

For we know that if our earthly dwelling, a tent, should be destroyed, we have a building from God, a dwelling not made with hands, eternal in heaven.

## **A Reading from the Letter of Paul to the Philippians**

Rejoice in the Lord always. I shall say it again: rejoice! Your kindness should be known to all. The Lord is near. Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God. Then the peace of God that surpasses all understanding will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus.

Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is gracious, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things. Keep on doing what you have learned and received and heard and seen in me. Then the God of peace will be with you.

Then we who are alive, who are left, will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. Thus, we shall always be with the Lord. Therefore, console one another with these words.
